Timely information for those wanting to fly-in to Sporty's, but do not have ADS-B installed!

Hi Dale,

Here's a few notes on the process of filing a deviation with the FAA to fly into Clermont County without ADS-B.

As of January 1, 2020 ADS-B out capability is necessary to enter the Mode C veil around Greater Cincinnati airport, which includes Clermont County airport. It is possible to operate in the airspace without ADS-B out capability if a deviation is filed and granted by the FAA. The procedure is pretty easy, if not particularly straightforward, and can all be completed online.

- 1. The first step is to visit https://sapt.faa.gov/form.php to fill out the request form. Only the blue boxes need to be filled, enter the pertinent information where needed. A few notes:
 - a. The form must be filled out at least 1 hour before the flight, but less than 24
 - b. Do NOT enter the departure or destination airports in the "route" box. If you're flying over a VOR, you might put it in the box, but the system will work just fine if you leave it blank.
 - c. Altitude is entered in hundreds of feet so 4,500 ft is entered as 45.
- 2. Click "Check Availability." The system will confirm that you can be tracked via radar, since you do not have ABS-B
- 3. Click "Request an Authorized Deviation for this flight"
- 4. Fill out the remaining information on the form that appears.
 - a. In the "Reason for Request" field, I have selected "Fringe Operation" and successfully been granted the deviation for Clermont County
 - b. Enter a good email address, as the official permit is delivered to that address
- 5. Click "Submit." In my experience, the deviation is approved immediately.
- 6. Don't forget to file another deviation for the flight home!
